STATEMENTS

MCA Loosuk Ward, (Hon. Adamson Lanyasunya): Thank you Hon. Speaker. I hereby request for a statement from the Chair of the sectoral Committee on Tourism, Trade and Cooperatives. Pursuant to Standing Order No. 45 (2 c), I hereby request for a Statement from the Chair of the sectoral Committee on Tourism, Trade, Cooperative Development and Marketing concerning the expenditure on new conservancies and the plight of Lkurkur Rangers' Camp.

Kenya has lost approximately 70 % of its wildlife during the past thirty years. Loss of space and connectivity and the increasing development pressures and impact of climate change is threatening Kenya's aquatic wide life. It is multi-billion tourism industry and livelihood for rural communities. With 65% of Kenyan wild life live in community and private lands conservancies provide connected land scales that complement national parks and reserves by enabling communities to benefit from wild life management and in turn, at the heart of championing conservation effort.

In Kenya today, conservancies are recognized land use and the wild life Act of 2013 making them an attractive land use option for communities and land owners as they offer improved land and resource rights and access to incentives.

By placing communities at the centre of wild life conservation and improving conservation initiatives, conservancies in Kenya are recurring livelihood while reserving wildlife decline resulting in the protection of Kenya's wild life for future generations.

The Samburu County Government establishes six new conservatives in 2013 and the County Assembly has been allocating Sh. 85 million through the department of Tourism and Cooperative Development for the management and improvement of these conservancies. These funds are meant for the payment of salaries for the rangers and other operational costs. The department has also been budgeting for construction of camps in these conservancies and with the support of this House the Assembly has been approving the budgets.

It is too unfortunate therefore that the conservancy rangers can go for six months without salaries and some camps are still not constructed for the comfort and hospitality of our

rangers. Lkurkur camp being one of the camps in question located at Malaso – Ltunkai Conservancy.

In light of the above the Chair should inquire into and report on:

1. What was the total budget for the new conservancies for the FY 2018/2019?
2. How much was withdrawn for each month and how much was spent and the expenditure backed with receipts and other accounting documents should be presented?
3. Why the department failed to provide water for Lkurkur Rangers Camp and where was the approved Sh. 5000 for the drilling and equipping of boreholes and the approved funds for fencing of the camp?
4. Why is the department harassing Lkurkur and has refused to improve their working conditions?
5. Why the rangers are deducted 24,000 each which was meant for their foodstuff and salaries during the month of June and yet they performed their duties as expected?

MCA Wamba West Ward, (Hon. Benjamin Leitore): Thank you Hon. Speaker. We will forward the statement to the relevant department and we shall report back on Wednesday next week.

I sought a statement last week on feeding programme for the ECD children and the Speaker directed for it to be answered today. Therefore, I seek to be given an answer to my Statement.

MCA Suguta Marmar Ward, (Hon. Shadrack Lesoipa): Thank you Hon. Speaker. It is true that the Hon. Member requested for the Statement that was directed to the Department of Education. It is unfortunate that I requested for an answer from the department but the clerks of the Assembly never handed over the question to the department. Therefore, the Office of the Clerk should be able to hand over the request for the department to be able to give us the feedback.

The Speaker, (Mr. Lempere Solomon): Do you mean that the department did not receive request for the Statement?

MCA Suguta Marmar Ward, (Hon. Shadrack Lesoipa): Yes. They have not received the request for the Statement.

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MCA Wamba West Ward, (Hon. Benjamin Leitore): To me, I see it as inefficiency of the Committee because anything directed by the Chair or the Speaker stands committed. Therefore, I wish to have a better explanation from the Chair because the issues I raised were very pertinent and it is an issue of great concern to this County. Through your indulgence, the Chair should give to this House a more elaborate answer.

MCA Ndoto Ward, (Hon. Raisy Letura): Thank you Hon. Speaker. I wish to echo the sentiments of Hon. Member for Wamba West ward and also to inquire on the issue of the Statement as sought. The issue does not concern just residence of Wamba West but for the entire county.

It is shameful for the County Government and when we are fully devolved that our children go without for food about two months and they receive the ration the last month during the closure of schools.

As we were interrogating the budget, the CO Education informed this House that there is no food until the month of July. It is but a shame that as a county we are not able to feed our young ones and we are pretending that we are managing their nutritional status. If that is the case, then we are going to cause more malnourish children in the pretext of wanting to feed these children.

Therefore, the Hon. Chair for Education should be honest to this House because it is not the first time we are dealing with the department of Education. We have had several issues with the department and the committee has to come up clearly and tell us who is not doing his/her duties as expected. And to me, it is either the department or the committee because on several occasion, we receive complains on an answered Statements/ delays in answering these statements.

Hon. Speaker, with the power bestowed to you, we need a clear way on why food is not reaching our children yet they are supposed to be in school and the Chair too to be host enough to say what the problem is. We are not taking the answer that the Statement has not reached the department because that is the failure of the Committee or even the secretariat of this Assembly. Let us take the business of this House in very serious manner. Otherwise we are going to be seen as people who are not serious in their work.

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The Speaker, (Mr. Lempere Solomon): Let me give the direction because we do not have the Statement to really debate but I agree to the sentiments of the Hon. Members who have talked. I wish to give the direction that the statement to be answered by the Chair for Education on 2nd of July, 2019 at 2:30 pm. (*Applause*). Hon. Lanyasunya's Statement will be answered on Wednesday 3rd of July, at 2:30 pm.

MOTION

The Speaker, (Mr. Lempere Solomon): Hon. Members, this is a continuation of our debate yesterday and I will invite members to continue with the debate as we move ahead to approve the report.

MCA Wamba West Ward, (Hon. Benjamin Leitore): Thank you Hon. Speaker. I stand to move the following Motion as you indicated that this is a continuation of the yesterday's Motion, **THAT...** (*Interruption by the Speaker*).

The Speaker, (Mr. Lempere Solomon): Hon. Leitore, the Motion was already moved and the question proposed so continue and give your comment on it as to why you are supporting the Bill.

MCA Wamba West Ward, (Hon. Benjamin Leitore): Thank you Hon. Speaker. I am supporting the Motion as we proposed yesterday because as I indicated in my contribution, I wish to appreciate the support of the entire House and particularly the Budget Committee on our interrogation of the budget of FY 2019/2020.

After the public participation which lasted for almost one week, we invited the executive part of the government and we did our interrogations for almost three consecutive days and we reached on a conclusion and we were in a position to iron out pertinent issues in our budget and so we shall table a report that is all-agreed upon by both the entire House and the Executive. I am supporting the report and I am urging the entire House to support the report as it is, thank you.

As I continue, I wish to introduce the following amendments: (*Interruption by the Speaker*)

The Speaker, (Mr. Lempere Solomon): The amendments are with the addendum and it is part of the report and so it should be taken as part of the report. So, there is no need of introducing any amendment unless you have any other comment on the Bill.

MCA Wamba West Ward, (Hon. Benjamin Leitore): It is not actually introducing the amendment but I am only reading the amendments for the House.

The Speaker, (Mr. Solomon Lempere): Okay just proceed

MCA Wamba West Ward, (Hon. Benjamin Leitore): Mr. Speaker the Schedule R42 (2), 42(12) the department of the office of the Governor, Deputy Governor, County Secretary and County Public Service Board.

h) R 42 (19) there are a few issues that I would like to raise, first is the issue of support to Conservancies both the existing and the ones recently established, we have a total budget of about one hundred and one million, 60 million for existing Conservancies which is Kalama, Reteti and West Gate, we also have 95 million for the new ones and these ones mainly are in the North. Until now we do not have legislation on how these monies will be spent. I would like the relevant Committee to fast track the preparation of that Bill so that we ensure efficient utilization and meet the needs of these Conservancies.

Health department has done a good job to ensure that every item in the budget for instance what and where and what is going to be done. There are some budget lines especially under trade that are vague and this means it is going to be difficult to monitor these projects for example we have construction of latrines in markets, which markets are these. We also see construction of youth shades where we do not know which wards and which locations. Boda Boda shades where we do not know the locations. Also we do not know where the Shanga shades are. They should borrow lead from the Health, Lands and Roads Departments since they have spelt out their projects specifically. We again have to run to these departments to lobby for these projects since they are not specified. This takes a lot of time and unnecessary efforts. Maybe after this...but I do not know which Committee this belongs to Mr. Speaker? I do not know which Sectoral Committee is in charge of Budget so that we get to know which specific directorate... *(Interrupted)*

The Speaker, (Mr. Solomon Lempere): The Speaker is not asked questions. Just to give guidance, each Sectoral Committee is in charge of its sector, the Sectoral Committee on Lands is in charge of Lands and whatever is budgeted should be between the department and Committee.

MCA Waso Ward, (hon. Paul Wonyan'g): Mr. Speaker I apologize for asking you those irrelevant questions. I also want to go in record about the issue of Kalama and West Gate because they are going to have an AGM on Saturday where they will ask me this question;

these Conservancies are very intelligent and they are going to have a copy of this after this session and they are going to roast me. Kalama and West Gate will still require the 10 million. We had an agreement on the issue of cadastral surveying and titling plus valuation of roll calls are not a priority in Archer's, our priority is demarcation and beaconing, town planning and conflict resolutions within Archers town. This is why we want the 3 and 4.5 million under Lands to be lumped together so that it goes to solve the real problems affecting people in Archer's town especially in my Ward.

We should reduce the issue of going capacity building because it is one thing that has eaten into the time that we are supposed to take during the implementation of these Budgets. I am sure Members are not saying anything because they are afraid that they are going to be stripped of their allowances. We should spend more time in the Wards. We cannot go to the Wards if there are no projects being implemented. Let us work hard and say *kazi na maendeleo mashinani*. For these few remarks I support.

Majority Leader, (hon. Christopher Lentukunye): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I stand to support the report because this report is good and balanced. I refer to hon. Nkirau's Statement that wakati mwingine tunaletewa vitu na kudanganyiwa na peremende; I want to relate this Budget with the sweets that are brought to a child because everything is balanced but when you want to do something that perhaps caters for personal interest you have to add some decorations to catch the eye of the targeted. As I have stated in my Statement that this Budget is good and fairly distributed to all Wards in this County. As we approve this Budget report I call upon Members to exercise their three Constitutional mandates and more so the oversight.

Before the elections we went to all Wards and made pledges that we were elected upon; since elections not a single project had been implemented. As we approve this Budget we have that fear that we will only pass this Budget to give the executive to spend this money that is intended to benefit the community. This House should do oversight on all projects contained in this Budget. We are very worried because when we approve Budget we tell our people that this is what we are preparing for you but the arm of the Government charged with implementation has no interest to its people. The people's interest is in the hands of these Members. This House should take its roles seriously. I want to thank the Members for taking their time since we have been here since Monday engaging the executive on the previous Budget and what came to our attention is that they are not committed to their work.

We do not expect anything to happen if this House does not take up its mandate. Before we engaged ourselves in the discussion of our Budget there was a Statement sought by hon. Leitore regarding the distribution of ECD food that has been a tendency especially of that department by doing just one month to the closure of schools and since opening no food was distributed to these centers yet these are very young kids who cannot concentrate without food. The food is budgeted yet it is a tradition that they give food one week to the closure of the schools. This shows the executive does not take the people's interests accordingly. I support the report, thank Mr. Speaker.

MCA Wamba West, (hon. Benjamin Leitore): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I appreciate the support from the Members towards the report. I assure the Members that the report has taken consideration of all sectors; to the extent of the Youth, Disabled and Women. We made commitment as the Budget Committee to ensure full implementation of the Budget by the executive. I request for support from the House since in the month of July we will call the executive to give an explanation on the recurrent expenditure report. I thank the House for giving the report the support that it requires, thank you Mr. Speaker.

The Speaker, (Mr. Solomon Lempere): Thank you hon. Members. I now put the question that this County Assembly adopts the report of the Budget and Appropriation Committee on the Budget estimates for the County Government and the County Assembly tabled in the County Assembly on 13th June 2019.
